

Back to School Supplies for Math with Mrs. Miller

One (or two) 3 ring binder(s), a calculator (recommended but not required), and pencils...

1) A 3 ring binder: The bigger the better because you will receive note-takers, hand-outs, and/or worksheets almost daily. Some students have a small one they bring to class containing the most current units and keep a larger one at home containing the notes for the whole year. It is recommended to save all notes throughout the year to help review for the cumulative final at the end of the year.

2) A simple calculator is recommended for homework. These can even be purchased at a dollar store. Almost all homework assignments can be done without a graphing calculator.

3) OPTIONAL: TI-84 Graphing calculator. It is highly recommended that student have their own TI-84 calculator to use for the course. Because these are an investment, it is not required. There will be calculators in class for students to use on all classwork and assessments. If the student is planning on taking many more math classes throughout high school and college, I highly suggest buying one so the student is familiar with it. The more you know your calculator and all of its functions, the less you will struggle to use it in higher math classes and on important tests.

4) PENCILS and ERASERS are needed daily for math! (Pens are highly NOT recommended!)
